Rosa Grizzo has been honing her study and production techniques based on daily activities for more than ten years. Because many of these tasks are connected to the feminine realm, mundane activities like making breakfast, taking a walk, or taking care of household chores induce automatism and numbness through repetition, making those who carry them out invisible or erasing them, especially women. By closely examining these acts with a critical eye and a compassionate heart, the artist hopes to challenge this invisibility. She used stitching, a craft intimately associated with the feminine sphere, to delicately and painstakingly express herself.

As they support interventions with lines and fabric scraps that emphasize time passing, dedication, the frustration of non-recognition, the erasure of oneself, the oppression that women face on various levels (regardless of social class), and the abandonment of dreams, frayed fabrics, layette items, scarves, quilt or towel cuttings, and frames take on new meanings.

Injuries emerge, recurring forms take on shadows, the rigidity of geometry is called into doubt, and what ought to be contained seeps and spills into the ground. A great deal of determination and nonconformity that is forming with both power and gentleness.

One of the things that art can do is stimulate the mind. If we examine closely, we shouldn't be shocked by the method or the materials that are employed. Contemporary art allows us to look critically about what is established and even things we are unaware of. On various textiles, paintings and drawings are created using colors and lines. By modernizing processes and materials, the artist of today helps us perceive what is around us and brings History closer to us. Even while we don't always grasp poetry, we are still moved and compelled to reflect by its beauty. similar to what Rosa Grizzo is able to accomplish to us.

I am a woman, cis, white, and privileged. I was taught to provide for the household, children, and family. This pattern of conduct imposed by patriarchal and capitalist society defines our obligations, as well as our virtues and shortcomings as women.

I lived by this routine, but I constantly questioned my part. We conduct everyday, unseen work that has become a cornerstone of capitalism and is romanticized as an act of love and contribution to the family.

I grew up hearing complaints from dissatisfied. women who were deliberately or unconsciously, with the imposed norm and living off the needs of the house, which prevented us from creating our own biography and searching for our identity and subjectivity.

By resuming the thread of my life and returning to my training in visual arts, I brought to my research, through various languages (object, photography, installation, and video), the search for understanding everyday life and my memories, which, while unique, can also be viewed in a broader context that includes other women.




