

Orgânics

In the presence of something that provokes strangeness, his poetics seek to heighten sensations and hone the sense of observation while also sharpening the imagination. An alternate reality pertaining to the characteristics and composition of various ecosystem occupants. The viewer's imagination is a crucial component in enhancing the visual experience and greatly influencing the conversation about props like fringe, plastic, toothpicks, and ceramic pieces, which are essential components for any piece to cast onto the exterior surface of the body, including its tentacles, eyes, and spines that contaminate the surrounding area. The construction of each work gains movement and shape through the technique of interweaving crochet stitches, which when superimposed result in twisted folds. This leads to the finalization of the body that crawls, stays suspended, and fits itself into the structures, creating a parallel world of imaginary animals.

















textil art - learn about the technique
